Are you a civil engineer with a passion for what you do? Have you worked on an exciting project that you're bursting to tell someone about? Have you ever wanted to share your knowledge to a wider audience?

If so, then make sure you apply for Pitch 200, ICE's competition to find the person who can best demonstrate a civil engineering related concept or project in a 200 second video.

You are invited to make your entry as weird and wonderful as possible using anything at your disposal to explain your chosen idea, the use of props is highly encouraged.

How to enter

Complete the form below and send a short 1 minute video summary of your concept or project. Entries will then be shortlisted and the best will be invited to make their full 200 second presentations at the regional heat, taking place on 1 May 2019. The winner being decided by a panel of judges.

The judging panel will be looking for the best presentation of a technical idea to a non-specialist audience. The regional winner will be put forward for consideration in the final to be held in London.

The competition is open to all ICE members, whatever your membership grade. The winner will become an ICE Regional Ambassador (providing a 'money can't buy' prize that greatly increases the profile and contacts of the winner).

What do I need to do?

Applying for this competition is easy. All you need to do is:

1. Fill in the form below and send us a 60 second video via [WeTransfer](#) or [Dropbox](#) to iceeastofengland@ice.org.uk presenting your idea, concept or project. The closing date for applications is 13 March 2019.
2. Videos will then be shortlisted and entrants notified if successful.
3. Shortlisted entries will be invited to make a longer 200 second presentation at the Pitch 200 regional heat on 1 May 2019. This will be at The Plough, Shepreth, near Royston.
4. The regional heat winner will go forward for consideration for the ICE Pitch 200 final.

How will the videos be judged?

Videos will be shortlisted based on how interesting, novel and clear they are. Please be aware, the first 60 second video can be used to explain what you would do in the longer 200 second presentation, giving us an indication of what you have planned
