- establishing the standards of qualification, experience and training necessary for inclusion on ICE approved Dispute Resolution Registers;
- identifying improvements or new services and products for ICE's Dispute Resolution Services;
- organising the Alternative Dispute Resolution CPD workshops and seminars;
- reviewing and amending ICE's Dispute Resolution procedures; and
- assessing the eligibility of people applying to join the Dispute Resolution Registers.

What makes a suitable candidate?

- Candidates must have a passion for ensuring that the ICE continues to highlight and promote the highest standards in relation to dispute resolution.

The ICE Dispute Resolution Committee seeks to improve diversity in all respects within its committee and registers. The Committee therefore warmly welcomes applications from all who are interested in the role.

The Dispute Resolution Committee are looking to fulfil many different areas of specialities, if you have one or more of the following please apply:

- have Dispute Resolution experience, or an interest in Construction Law, Adjudication, Arbitration and Mediation;
- experience as a committee member within a professional institution; and/or
- experience in producing and reviewing examinations.

Committee members will be asked to serve for 3 years. The role is voluntary – however committee member's expenses are reimbursed. The terms of reference are available upon request.
